授業のねらい							アクティブ ラーニング の 類 型
<p>In the first half of the course, you will firstly understand what IR is, and if it is developed in Nagasaki, what economic effects it will have on Sasebo City and its surrounding areas. Secondly, an IR is a huge tourist facility, which includes hotels, MICE facilities, attractions, etc., so there is a possibility that you will be involved in IR in the future. Therefore, in the course, I will introduce many kinds of jobs that will be created if IR is developed in Nagasaki, based on my business experience in tourism industry.</p> <p>In the second half of the course, you will learn more about IR facilities. To do so, it is essential to correctly understand what the nature of gambling casinos. In addition, regarding newly established IR facilities, you will learn how the operator can bring customers from overseas and pay back a large amount of their investment, and you will understand how transportation infrastructure around Huis Ten Bosch will change. Also, you will consider some negative concerns that the IR might bring to the surrounding area and countermeasures to these effects. Through the above procedures, you can acquire a basic expertise in IR and collect, analyze, and present the information on the various effects and impacts associated with the development of IR facilities.</p>							②③④⑥⑨ ⑩

<p>In each lecture, a quiz is conducted using the portfolio to confirm and establish your understanding of the content, and 30% of evaluation is made based on the results. Also, in order to summarize your ideas based on the knowledge learned in the lectures, and to be able to present those ideas to others, you will be required to write two short reports. Issues for the reports will be raised in the eighth (planned) lecture and the 15th (planned) lecture, and 70% (30% + 40%) of evaluation is made based on the content of the reports you will submit. Also, the second report will be prepared by a group of 3-4 people and will be presented.</p>							
授業の概要							
<p>In the first half of this course, you will gain an understanding of what IR is and what it means to have an IR in Nagasaki. In the latter half, you will learn more about operation of IR facilities from the viewpoint of tourism management, and will be able to collect and analyze information, and to summarize and present your own opinions on the issues raised in some lectures, guest speakers such as IR companies will be on stage. Although a regular examination is not conducted, all evaluations are made by quizzes conducted every lecture and reports given twice, so it is a strict course that requires active and independent participation throughout the lecture period. In particular, when a guest speaker comes from outside, I would like you to listen to the lecture in quieter and more focused manner. Also, this lecture is expected to have a synergistic learning effect by attending the “theme park theory” set in the second half of the first year and “the tourism business theory” set in the first half of the second year. (However, taking these courses are not required.) In addition, the content of “IR theory”, which is offered in the first semester, largely overlaps with the content of this lecture, but it can be meaningful for you to take both courses mainly because I will change guest speakers.</p>
