## 評価基準及び評価手段・方法の補足説明

During the term, students will complete assignments related to reading. These assignments will evaluate how well the students learned the reading skills taught during the course as well as comprehended the reading material. Students will also complete projects to demonstrate their in-depth reading ability and ability to work with reading materials creatively. Furthermore, students will complete quizzes based on their extensive reading material to demonstrate engagement and understanding of the material. Students will be given feedback both in-person and through online grading for each activity and assignment.

## 授業の概要

Students will learn a variety of basic but necessary reading and comprehension skills that will help them to succeed academically in English. Students will do a large amount of reading to improve their reading fluency and speed as well as increase their vocabulary. Students will also complete creative activities, class discussions, and projects to improve their ability to engage with written material primarily outside of class.
