Students will be given feedback both in-person and through online grading for each activity and assignment.</p>

<p>This course is held twice a week. Students will continue to improve on writing skills learned in previous courses. Students are also given time to perform journal writing and process teacher feedback by in their class notebook. Individual one-on-one writing assistance will be given for all levels.</p> <p>Projects are completed during the term.
